2. Credits

Diploma in Acupuncture science under two semester pattern. Each semester contains 6credits for theory papers and 4 credits for practical paper. Totally, 30 hours lectures perweekwith20credits.

3. Semesters

An academic year is divided into two Semesters. In each semester, courses are offered ina minimum of 15 teaching weeks and the remaining 3-5 weeks are to be utilized forconduct of examination and evaluation purposes. Each week has 30 working hoursspreadover5daysaweek.

6. Eligibility for Admission:

A candidate who has passed HSC (+2) Examination conducted by the Government of TamilNadu, or an equivalent examinations shall be permitted to appear and qualify fortheDiplomainAcupunctureScience..

7. Minimum Duration of Programme

Theprogrammeisforoneyear, consist of two semesters Odd and Evensemesters. Odd semester s shall be from June / July to October / November and even semesters shall be from November / December to April / May. Each semester there shall be 90 working days consisting of 6 teaching hours perworking day (5 days/week).

8. Medium ofinstruction

ThemediumofinstructionisTamilorEnglish.

9. TeachingMethods

The classroom teaching would be through conventional lectures, the use of OHP, Power Point presentation, and novel innovative teaching ideas like television, smart board, and computer-aided instructions. Periodic field visit enables the student for gathering practical experience and up-to-date Field scenario. Student seminars would be arranged to improve their communicative skills.

The practical classes shall be conducted with special efforts to teach scientificknowledge to students. The students shall be trained to handle needling and handlingpatients shall be allowed to do experiments independently. The periodic test will beconducted for students to assess their knowledge.

Slowlearnerswouldbeidentified and will be given special attention by remedial coaching.

10. Attendance:

Studentsmusthaveearned 75% of attendance in each course for appearing for the examination.

Students who have earned 74% to 70% of attendance to be applied for condonation in the prescribe d form with the prescribe dfee.

Students who have earned 69% to 60% of attendance to be applied for condonation in the prescribe dform with the prescribe dfee along with the medical certificate.

Students who have below 60% of attendance are not eligible to appear for the examination. They shall re-dothese mester (s) after completion of the programme.

11. Examination

Theexaminations shall be conducted separately for theory and practical stoassess (remember in g, understanding, applying, analyzing, evaluating, and creating) the knowledge required during the study. There shall be two systems of examinations viz., internal and external examinations. The internal examinations shall be conducted as Continuous Internal Assessment test.

12. ContinuousinternalAssessment:

- a. ContinuousInternalAssessmentforeachpapershallbebymeansofWrittenTests,Assignments, ClasstestsandSeminars.
- b. **25 marks** allotted for the Continuous Internal assessment is distributed for WrittenTest,Assignment,ClasstestandSeminars.
- c. one Internal Test of 2 hours duration may be conducted during the semester for each course / subject and the best marks may be considered and one Model Examinationwillbeconducted at the end of these mester prior to University examination. Students may be asked to submit at least five assignments in each subject. They should also participate in Seminars conducted for each subject and marks allocated accordingly.
- d. Conduct of the continuous internal assessment shall be the responsibility of theconcerned faculty.
- e. The continuous internal assessment marks are to be submitted to the University at the end of everyy ear.
- f. The valued answer papers/assignments should be given to the students after thevaluation is over and they should be asked to check up and satisfy themselves aboutthemarkstheyhavescored.
- g. All mark lists and other records connected with the continuous internal assessments should be in the safecustody of the institution for at least one year after the assessment.

13. ExternalExamination

However, candidates who have arrears in practical shallbepermittedtotaketheirarrearPracticalexaminationonlyalongwithregularpracticale xaminationintherespectivesemester.
- c. A candidate should get registered for the first-semester examination. If registration isnotpossibleowingtoashortageofattendancebeyondthecondonationlimit/regulation prescribed OR belated joining OR on medical grounds, the candidates are permitted to move to the next semester. Such candidates shall re-do the missedsemesteraftercompletionoftheprogramme.
- d. Viva-Voce: Each candidate shall be required to appear for the Viva-Voce Examination for each practical paper.

14. Passing minimum

a. Acandidate shall bedeclaredtohavepassed each courseifhe/shese cures not less than 40% marks in the End Semester Examinations and 40% marks in the Internal Assessment and not less than 40% for Diploma the aggregate, taking Continuous assessment and End Semester Examinations markstogether.

- b. The candidates not obtained 40% in the Internal Assessment are permitted to improve their Internal Assessment marks in the subsequent semesters (2 chances will be given) by writing and submitting assignments.
- c. Candidates, who have secured the pass marks in the End-Semester Examination and the CIA but failed to secure the aggregate minimum pass mark (E.S.E + C I.A), are permitted to improve their Internal Assessment mark in the following semester and/or in University examinations.

d. Acandidatewho getslessthan40% in the Practical examination, such candidates need to take again the Practicals.

15. Standard of Passing and Award of Division:
